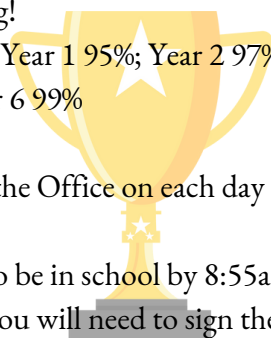

Nursery
