

# What Three Questions?

## Nursery

Can you tell someone at home two things you know about fire fighters?

Topic (Community People) - What is the full/extended name for a Vet?

Phonics - What is a comma and why do we use it?

Maths - Is the number 5 odd or even? How do you know?

## Year 1

Maths: Partition these numbers: 46, 82, 75, 99

English: What is the technical name for 'bossy verbs'?

Science: Why is a lion an unsuitable pet?

## Year 2

Maths: Can you add any four coins together?

Geography: Can you find out more about one of the continents?

English: What adjectives could you use to describe a family member?

## Year 3

Maths: Double these numbers; 25, 62, 54

English: What simile could you use to describe blue eyes?

Geography: What does it mean to say that Rio is a city of 'contrast'?

## Year 4

History: What evidence do we have today that shows us where the Vikings settled in England?

Science: Which metals have the highest and lowest boiling points?
