Reception

Can you look through a book at home and find the letters 's', 'a', 't', 'p' and say the phoneme (sound) e.g. s = "sssssssss"

Help an adult to prepare snack and count out 3 food items for each person.

Can you teach your family how to play the Cat and Mouse game from P.E.?

Year 1 English: What is a noun and what is an adjective?

Maths: What are the number bonds to 5?

RE: What happened in the Creation story in Genesis?

Year 3

English: What types of nouns do you need to create a figurative phrase e.g. a doorway of dreams?

Maths: Partition this number: 347.

PSHE: What are some everyday feelings we experience?

Year 4

Science: Can you name one natural habitat, its climate and the animals that live there?
