# Nursery

Can you retell parts of the story, Goldilocks and the Three Bears?

Can you find a small, medium and large toy and order them by size?

Can you practise using your manners by saying please and thank you?

# Reception

English: have a go at reading a rhyming book e.g. the Gruffalo, with a family member and finding the rhyming words in the story. Remember the end of the word needs to finish with the same phonemes/sounds – hat and bat.

Maths: what is one more and one less than 5?
