

Stars of the Week



Nursery

Reception

RE: Can you draw a picture to represent the Nativity story and use your phonic knowledge to independently label the different characters? E.g. Mary could phonetically be spelt 'Meree'

Maths: Using your fingers, can you show an adult the different ways you could represent numbers 6 and 7 and talk about how you formed them? E.g. 3 and 3 OR 4 and 2
