

# What Three Questions?

## Nursery

Can you sing the song we learnt this week, 'God Made Me'?

What was your favourite thing about our trip to the park?

What is your favourite memory of your year in Nursery?

## Reception

Literacy: Can you write a shopping list containing fruit and vegetables that you like using your phonic knowledge?

Maths: What number is halfway between 0 and 10?

Topic: What are some rules/helpful tips we've learnt when brushing our teeth?

## Year 1

Maths: Can you add and subtract 10 from any given 2-digit number?

English: What 4 conjunctions have we looked at this year?
