What Three Questions?

Nursery

What does Cinderella lose at the Ball?

Can you explain how you get to Nursery each day?

Can you tell your parents three rules for Nursery?
For example, being kind, sharing, staying out of each other's bubbles.

Reception

Literacy: In the book 'So Much' what actions/verbs did the the family members do with the baby to show that they loved him?
