What Three Questions?

Nursery

Literacy: Can you recognise your name independently?

Maths: Can you sing our measurement song to a member of your family?

RE: Can you retell the story of The Lost Sheep to a family member?

Reception

Maths: Can you find something light and something heavy in your home?

Literacy: Which character in our book has lots of red items?

Topic: What are the similarities between Yeh-Shen Cinderella and the Disney Cinderella?

Year 1

English: What is the name of our new class book?

Maths: How many 3D shapes can you name?

Geography: What is the difference between human and physical features?

Year 2

RE: Why do Muslims fast?

English: What types of environment have trees and what animals live there?

Maths: Describe 2D shapes: how many sides and vertices does each one have?

Year 3

Maths: If we know $1/5$ of 10 is 2, can you find $2/5$, $3/5$ and $4/5$?
