

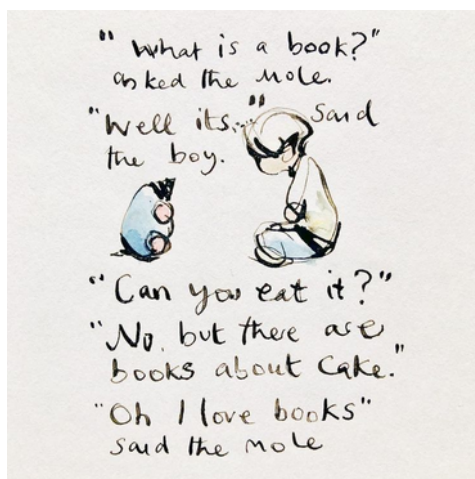


# St Saviour's Weekly Update

# What Three Questions?

## Nursery

Phonics: How many syllables does the word 'dinosaur' have?

Maths: Count a group of objects; use the counting techniques of either putting the objects in a line first before counting or moving one object from left to right as you count it.

P.E: Can you show a family member the Bear Crawl, Ape Jump and Inch Worm actions you learnt in PE?

## Reception

Literacy: What do you love doing with your family SO MUCH?

Maths: How many ways can you make 7?

RE: Why did Jesus have a last supper?

## Year 1

Maths: Can you say all of the number bonds to 20?

Science: What is the difference between mammals and birds?

English: What is the name of the story you are writing?

## Year 2

Geography: Can you name the 7 continents?

Science: Can you explain the difference between seeds and bulbs?

Computing: What information can we show on pictograms?

## Year 3

English: What prepositions could you use to describe the room you are in?

Geography: What information can an atlas tell us?

Science: How can we stay safe in the sun?

## Year 4

English: When Lenny arrives to the countryside he is shocked when he looks out the window. Why?

Maths: You have £50 and you spend £37.78. How much money do you have left?

Computing: Why do we collect data? Give an example of types of data we collect over time.

## Year 5

Science: Can you give an example of a life cycle of a mammal?

English: What do we need to include in a newspaper article?

Maths: How can we work out  $\frac{4}{5}$  of £150?

## Year 6

English: What are the common features of a fairy tale?

Maths: Where are the x and y axes situated on a graph?

R.E: How does Jesus' journey to the cross offer signs of hope to a Christian?
