What Three Questions?

Nursery

Literacy: Can you find examples of writing/text around London? e.g. road signs, tube adverts

RE: Can you practise singing our songs for the Christmas Performance?

Maths: Can you look at the 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' story and talk about what size bowl/chair/bed each bear owns and why?

Reception

Maths: What is a part of you? What is the whole?

Phonics: What new phase 3 sounds have we looked at this week?

PSHE: What does good turn taking / sharing look like?

Year 1

Maths: Can you use our position key words (like 'under', 'next to', 'behind') to describe where something is?

English: What is a sequel?

RE: Why do you think God told the shepherds about Jesus' birth first?

Year 2

Science: What are the 5 major food groups?

English: Can you convert the following words to past tense: Swim, think, is, go?

Maths: What is the difference between being over something and being on something? What other positional vocabulary can you use to describe somethings location?

Year 3

Geography: What are the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere?

English: What is a fronted adverbial and can you use one in a sentence?

Maths: I have £3.24 and spend £1.10 on apples. How much money do I have left?

Year 4

English: What is a subordinate clause?

Geography: How are we connected to the rainforest?

RE: What is peace to you?

Year 5

PSHE: What are the benefits and challenges of AI?

English: What is iambic pentameter?

Maths: What is 4,800 divided by 6? Work it out mentally and explain how you know.

Year 6

Maths: How is the area of a parallelogram calculated?

Geography: What are the physical characteristics of the U.K?

Science: What happens when fuels are burned?
