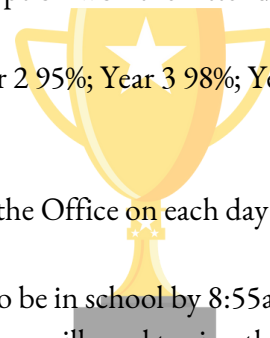

What Three Questions?

Nursery

Maths: Can you have a snack with a family member and carefully count out the amount of food each person needs? (up to 5)

Topic: Can you name different types of homes that you might find in London? e.g. townhouse

PSED: If you would like to play with someone, what could you say to them?

Reception

Phonics: Can you read the tricky words: I, into, the, go, no, is, a, he, she?

Maths: Can you find two groups of items and compare them? Which has more and which has less?

Topic: Why are friends important to us?

Year 1

English: What is a fact file?

Science: How does our sense of smell affect our taste?

Maths: How can we tell when two groups are equal?

Year 2

Science: What does it mean if a material is waterproof?

Computing: Can you think of 3 places in the world you might see people using IT?

R.E: What do the letters on a dreidel mean?

Year 3

English: What does an adverbial do and can you think of an example?

Maths: Using counting up (think of our frog jumps) can you draw a number line to solve 97-51?

Science: How are fossils made?

Year 4

English: When would you use a script?

Geography: What is it called when two rivers join together?

Computing: Can you download and use somebody's content from YouTube as your own? Why/why not?

Year 5

Geography: What is the difference between living/going to school in Athens and in London?

Maths: What are mental strategies we can use when subtracting decimals?
