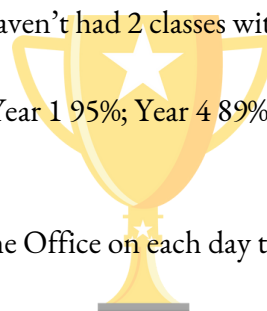


Attendance

What Three Questions?

Nursery

Literacy: Can you look through a rhyming story (The Gruffalo, Duck in the Truck) with an adult and predict the rhyming words in the sentence?

Maths: Can you create an obstacle course and use your positional language to direct a family member around the course?

Topic: What country does the fairy tale story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' originate from?

Literacy: What does Little Red give the wolf to stop him from eating people?

Topic: Can you find another Anansi the Spider story and draw a picture to show the lesson taught?
