School Street

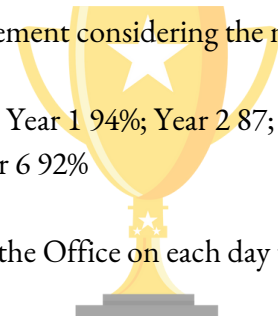
