Dear Reception Parents and Carers,

I hope everyone had a great first half term and you're all looking forward to the next as we have some exciting things planned in the run up to Christmas. We have some highly anticipated events coming up namely our Christmas Nativity performance which parents/careers are welcome to attend!

## Reading

Just as a reminder, reading records and phonics books need to be brought to school every day. This is crucial so that the Reception Staff are able to read that chosen book with your child at school. 'Reading for Pleasure' books can be changed as and when needed. The books will be changed weekly. Please supply your child with a book bag if you have not already done so.

# Spare clothes

Please provide another bag with spare clothes that we will keep at school. These spare items will need to be topped up in the bag as and when needed. If your child has borrowed school clothes to wear in an emergency, please wash and return them as we have a limited supply of spare clothes for the children.

# PE Day

Our PE Day is on Thursday. Please ensure your child comes into school in their PE kit.

### Water bottles and clothing

Children need to bring a water bottle every day. All water bottles, cardigans, jumpers, hats, scarves and book bags should be <u>labelled</u>. We have our own lost property box within Reception – if your child has lost any items in class please ask a staff member to go through the box. If your child has misplaced an item at Wrap Around or Club, please enquire via those channels concerned.

#### **Snack**

We provide a snack for the children, so the children do not need to bring in food. If you would still like to send your child with a snack, we ask for <u>only fresh fruit or vegetables.</u>
