
Reception Class Newsletter Term 2 2025-2026

Dear Reception Parents and Carers,

I hope everyone had a great first half term and you're all looking forward to the next as we have some exciting things planned in the run up to Christmas. We have some highly anticipated events coming up, including our Christmas Carol performance on 2nd December which parents/carers are welcome to attend! Information about tickets will be sent out on Arbor soon.

Reading

Just as a reminder, reading records and phonics books need to be brought to school every day. This is crucial so that the Reception Staff are able to read that chosen book with your child at school. 'Reading for Pleasure' books can be changed as and when needed. Please remind your children to return their books into school before they take another. The phonics books will be changed weekly on a Friday. Please supply your child with a book bag if you have not already done so.



The children who have been reading at home daily will be celebrated at our Friday Assemblies as a '**Reading Star**'. Please comment in your child's Reading Record **daily** so the staff can note their achievement.

Spare clothes

Please provide another bag with spare clothes that we will keep at school. These spare items will need to be topped up in the bag as and when needed. If your child has borrowed school clothes to wear in an emergency, **please wash and return** them as we have a limited supply of spare clothes for the children.

PE Day

Our PE Days are **Wednesday and Thursday**. Please ensure your child comes into school in their PE kit.

Water bottles and clothing

Children need to bring a water bottle every day. All water bottles, cardigans, jumpers, hats, scarves and book bags should be labelled. Please ensure your child **brings a coat to school every day**, as we have lots of outside learning opportunities and the weather is getting colder! We have our own lost property box within Reception - if your child has lost any items in class please ask a staff member to go through the box. If your child has misplaced an item at Wrap Around or Club, please enquire via those channels.

Snack

We provide a morning snack for the children which will consist of either a fruit or vegetable. Please provide your child **one piece of fruit /vegetables** for a quick afternoon snack. If your child has clubs, they may have further snacks for after school, but not during the school day.

Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Texts: 'I am Henry Finch' by Alexis Deacon, 'Halibut Jackson' by David Lucas• The main outcomes are to learn the structure and how to write simple timetables, thought-bubbles, lists and letters of advice. Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them, read words consistent with their phonic knowledge, read aloud simple sentences.
Phonics	Learning Phase 3 Sounds – j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu. Consonant digraphs - ch, sh, th, ng. Vowel digraphs - ai, ee, igh, oa.
Maths Number	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Explore the cardinality of 5• Begin to count beyond 5• Explore the concept of 'wholes' and 'parts'• Explore the composition of numbers within 5• Compare sets using a variety of strategies
Understanding the World Celebrations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Forest School: Explore the natural world, describe what they hear, see and feel outdoors, understanding the changing seasons.• Recognise the people have different beliefs• Recognise some environments that are different from the one in which they live.• Comment on familiar situations in the past
