CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

Applicants who wish to be considered under Criterion 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 must provide documentary evidence of their worship on the school's **Faith Leader's Form** and provide documentary evidence of the Baptism of their child (Criterion 2,3,4,or 5) by the application closing date. **Applications will not be accepted if these documents are not submitted at the same time as this form.**

Please answer the following questions:

1. Looked After Children* (including Looked After Children from outside England) and previously Looked After Children (including outside England) who ceased to be so because they were adopted, made subject to residence orders or special guardianship orders.

1. Baptised children, who are **regular, frequent**** worshippers with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) at either of the churches in the Parish of Little Venice (St. Saviour's Warwick Avenue, and St. Mary-on Paddington Green).

2. Baptised or dedicated children of Christian staff who have worked at the school for at least two years.
3. Baptised children who are **regular, frequent**** worshippers with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s), in other Anglican parishes.

Notes

*By 'looked after child', we mean a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school. A child is regarded as having been in state care outside of England if they were in the care of or were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation, or any other provider of care whose sole or main purpose is to benefit society. This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002. Child arrangements orders are defined in Section 8 of the Children Act 1989, as amended by Section 12 of the Children and Families Act 2014. Child arrangements orders replace residence orders and any residence order in force prior to 22 April 2014 is deemed to be a child arrangements order. See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians). Applications under this criterion should be accompanied by evidence to show that the child is looked after or was previously looked after (e.g. a copy of the adoption, child arrangements or special guardianship order).

****“Frequent and regular worship” signifies 40 Sundays or main services per year and for at least one year. This will be calculated pro rata taking account of closures.**

Please note this variation regarding church/place of worship closures due to COVID 19: In the event that during the period specified for attendance at worship the church or, in relation to those of other faiths, relevant place of worship has been closed for public worship and has not provided alternative premises for that worship, the requirements of these admissions arrangements in relation to attendance will only apply to the period when the church [or in relation to those of other faiths, relevant place of worship] or alternative premises have been available for public worship, or to the period when attendance at the church [or relevant place of worship has not been affected by limitations on numbers attending as a consequence of the place of worship complying with Public Health advice (such as social distancing measures which limit the numbers who can attend at any one time).

In the event of oversubscription, places will be allocated in the order of the published criteria.

Any applicant who is successful under Criterion 8 will be expected to provide formal proof of residency at the time of application.

An application for a child with an Educational, Health and Care Plan (EHC Plan) which names the school will be considered provided the school can meet the needs of said child. An Education, Health and Care Plan is a plan made by the local authority under Section 37 of the Children and Families Act 2014 specifying the special education, health and social care provision required for that child.

This may well have an impact on the number of children who can be admitted through the School's Admission Criteria.

If a child has exceptional social, medical, pastoral or other need, compelling evidence from an appropriate professional would need to be provided.

In the case of casual admittance, if a place becomes available in the school, the Admissions Committee will review children waiting for a place in accordance with the above Criteria. If there are no children waiting, places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.
