Dear Year 2 Parents and Carers,





Welcome to Year 2! We are excited to be starting this year with your child.

Reading for Pleasure Books- Your child can choose a new book each day, if they would like
Phonics reading books- send these into school daily, as we will be using them with your child
Reading records- please record the reading you do with your child and at home. This is also a great place to ask the Year Two team any questions you have related to reading
Mathletics- Log in information will be shared and homework set weekly on Mathletics.
Project- This term we will be doing a music project focusing on Black musical heroes. The project will be set on Google Classroom.
